

Navarre Intermediate Center Uniform Policy –

In Effect on August 1, 2007

Appropriate Uniform Bottoms:

Item	Colors	Styles, Restrictions, & Other Information
Pants	navy or khaki	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • solid colored, regular dress pants • no cargo pants, mesh, nylon, bikers or sweatpants • no oversized clothing allowed • may not be rolled up, use rubber bands, or any type of tie up • if it has belt loops you must wear a plain black or brown belt
Skirts	navy or khaki	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • solid colored • must be no shorter than the top of the knee caps • no oversized clothing allowed • if it has belt loops you must wear a plain black or brown belt
Capris	navy or khaki	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • permitted ONLY during 1st and 4th quarters • solid colored • no oversized clothing allowed • if it has belt loops you must wear a plain black or brown belt
Shorts	navy or khaki	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • permitted ONLY during 1st and 4th quarters • solid colored • no cargo shorts, mesh, nylon, bikers or sweats • must be no shorter than the top of the knee caps • no oversized clothing allowed • if it has belt loops you must wear a plain black or brown belt

Appropriate Uniform Tops:

Shirts or Blouses	white, yellow, or blue	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • solid colored • must have sleeves (short, ¾, or long) • must have collars (pointed, polo, Peter Pan, or button down) • may be knit or dress shirt • must be free of wording, emblems, decorations, or logos • must be buttoned up to the first button from the top (top button may be unbuttoned) • no oversized clothing allowed • no “capped sleeves” • no tank tops, halters, cropped, mesh, spaghetti straps, or double shirts • no hoodies or tie backs • must be tucked in at the waist if longer than waist length. • Maybe be tucked in but loose enough to enough to cover all stomach and back area above pants at all times
Sweaters	white or navy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • solid colored • cardigan, vest, or pull-over (v-neck or crew) • must be worn over uniform shirt or blouse • no hoodies or kangaroo pouches • must be free of wording, emblems, decorations, or logos • may have a zippered or buttoned front on cardigan • no oversized clothing allowed
Undershirts & Turtlenecks	white only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • must be free of wording, emblems, decorations, or logos • solid colored • must be worn under a uniform shirt or blouse • no oversized clothing allowed
Ties (optional)	navy only	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • solid colored • must be worn with a uniform dress shirt or blouse • no oversized clothing allowed • must be a school approved style (contact office or see display)

Appropriate Uniform Shoes:

Gym Shoes	white, black, or brown / including laces	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • may be hook and loop fastened • velcro or other similar fasteners must be properly and tightly fastened • laces must be laced and tied tightly • non-marking soles (not black) • must be worn with socks, hose, or tights
Dress Shoes	white, black, or brown / including laces	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • may be hook and loop fastened • velcro or other similar fasteners must be properly and snugly fastened • laces must be laced and tied tightly • no slides, flip-flops, or high heels • heels must be 1 inch or less in height • must be worn with socks, hose, or tights

Sandals	white, black, or brown	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> permitted only during 1st and 4th quarters velcro or other similar fasteners must be properly and snugly fastened must have backs to them no slides, flip-flops, or high heels heels must be 1 inch or less in height must be worn with socks, hose, or tights
Socks, hose, or tights	white, black, or brown	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> must be free of wording, emblems, decorations, or logos solid colored must be worn at all times

Costs:

A review of local and internet vendor prices shows these cost ranges:

- Shirts and blouses = \$5 to \$17
- Pants = \$10 to \$23
- Sweaters = \$12 to \$24
- Shoes = \$10 to \$29
- Belts = \$4 to \$11

Enforcement:

The following consequences will be applied for non-compliance:

First non-compliance:

- Parent contact by telephone
- Student takes home Uniform Policy for parent to sign.

Second non-compliance:

- Parent contact by telephone
- Parent conference with administration/designee
- Student removed from all extra curricular activities until conference is held.

Third non-compliance:

- Parent contact by telephone
- After-school detention

Additional non-compliance:

- Parent contact by telephone
- In school suspension

*Uniform loaner shirts will be available for use during the day and parents will be contacted.

* Excessive use of the loaner shirt will be considered as non-compliance.

In the event that our school uniform policy conflicts with religious or strongly-held philosophical beliefs, a student’s parent or guardian may submit a request for an exemption and an exemption questionnaire to the school uniform waiver committee. The committee will review the request and will present a recommendation to the school principal who will decide whether to grant or deny the exemption. The principal or other designated administrator will in turn notify the parent in writing of the decision.

A parent or guardian may appeal the principal’s decision denying an exemption by submitting a written request to the Superintendent (or designee) within five school days of receiving the denial. The Superintendent (or designee) will meet with the parent to discuss the request for an exemption, will review the request, and will decide whether to uphold, or overturn the principal’s denial within five school days of meeting with the parent. If the Superintendent (or designee) upholds the principal’s denial, he or she will explain the decision in writing to the parent.
